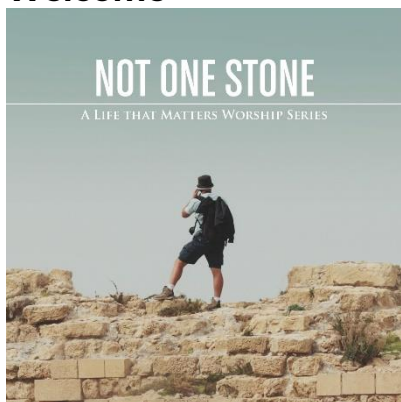

PASTORAL PRAYER
