# We Gather to Prepare Our Hearts to Meet Our Lord



### Prelude Welcome Announcements/Joys & Concerns

We're back on more comfortable ground this week. Today we have the promise of presence. Supposedly, John Wesley's final words were "best thing of all, God is with us." We love to celebrate that God is with us and we are not alone. That is a powerful message at any time of the year.

Jeremiah knows intimately about the presence of God. In fact, truth be told, if you keep reading in the book, presence can be a burden to bear. Jeremiah struggled with it. God seemed to want to direct all his steps, not just the ones to church each week. God seemed to want to put all the words in his mouth, not just the ones he used to make prophecies. Jeremiah 1:4-10

5 "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you; I appointed you a prophet to the nations."

6 Then I said, "Ah, Lord God! Truly I do not know how to speak, for I am only a boy." 7 But the Lord said to me,

"Do not say, 'I am only a boy,' for you shall go to all to whom I send you, and you shall speak whatever I command you. 8 Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you to deliver you, says the Lord."

9 Then the Lord put out his hand and touched my mouth, and the Lord said to me,

"Now I have put my words in your mouth.

10 See, today I appoint you over nations and over kingdoms, to pluck up and to pull down, to destroy and to overthrow, to build and to plant."

So, the question we consider for this week is how much of your life are you really willing to surrender to God?

Like Hosea and his desire to love us into wholeness, Jeremiah claims that God knows us into service and witness. God works within us to make us what we already are and to grow into what we will be.

How does God speak to us? How do we know God's direction in our lives?

There is a lot of uncertainty about how this works. Jeremiah and all the prophets make it sound like there are voices in the night. And maybe for some, there are. But for most of us, there is a warm heart, or a persistent urge, or something that brings tears or hope. In all of these ways, God through the Spirit, makes God's will known for our lives. Because God knows us so intimately, God is always on our side.

# CALL TO WORSHIP AND ACTION

The Lord calls to us to go into the world– We will go! God commands us speak as God commands– We will speak! God assures us, "Do not be afraid"— We trust that God will deliver us!

## **GENERAL PRAYER**

In Jeremiah, we read how you formed our souls, long before anyone knew us. You consecrated us for kingdom work long before our birth. You've called us to be a prophet to the nations! We know that life moves in cycles of growth and destruction, picking and pulling, building and overthrowing.
