November 3, 2024

All Saints Day is one of those moments where we celebrate and remember those who have made the journey or who have taken the next step. We remember them because they are still a part of us, shaping us, mentoring us – maybe not in a direct way, but in a real way. John Wesley, founder of the Methodist movement, enjoyed and celebrated All Saints Day. In a journal entry from November 1, 1767, Wesley calls it "a festival I truly love." On All Saints Day, we recognize that we are part of a giant choir singing the same song. It is the song Jesus taught his disciples; a tune that has resonated for more than 2,000 years; a melody sung in glory and on the earth. Our great privilege is to add our voices to this chorus.



November 10, 2024

Today Jesus is asking us to keep a vision of the kin-dom before us always, to look beyond this moment—for good or for all—and see what God has in store for creation. We are not asked to ignore the moment; this isn't a call to pie-in-the-sky blindness. Instead, we live

in this moment; we work in this moment, because we know what is coming; we know the promise and that gives us courage to keep going forward, even when it seems as if we are hitting a wall and not accomplishing anything. We worship a God of peace when there is no peace. We act as brothers and sisters of one loving family, even when we are divided and filled with hate.

Our Gospel reading today is not an easy one. You see, Jesus did not hesitate to talk of the end times. And as a matter of fact, in addition to what we have from Jesus today, we also acknowledge that God called on John to give him a vision to write what we know as Revelation. Each week we will watch a 10-minute Video followed by a time of connectional open forum and discussion.


Zoom Study Opportunity to be led by Bishop Lanette Plambeck
