Opening Meditation

Our Gospel reading today is not an easy one. You see, Jesus did not hesitate to talk of the end times. And as a matter of fact, in addition to what we have from Jesus today, we also acknowledge that God called on John to give him a vision to write what we know as Revelation. The truth of the end times is not mere speculation, but has an intensely practical purpose to strengthen, reassure, and nerve believers as we face the impending woes.

Better that we know that something is coming that to be caught unaware. Right?

Jesus says they will deliver you up to councils and governors and kings for my sake and surely the day of standing before councils, governors and kings is not over, and never will be over as long as time in this world endures.

With these words of warning Jesus also give us his words of assurance as he says, 13:9-23 "Do not be anxious about what to say – With a faith in the living God, out of that relationship with Him will spring words of life for every circumstance."

So let us remember that the small decisions we make every day will lead up to the moment of testing which will give us the courage to stand in the moment it matters most. Gospel Reading...... Mark 13:9-23 (NRSV)

Persecution Foretold

9 "As for yourselves, beware, for they will hand you over to councils, and you will be beaten in synagogues, and you will stand before governors and kings because of me, as a testimony to them. 10 And the good news[a] must first be proclaimed to all nations. 11 When they bring you to trial and hand you over, do not worry beforehand about what you are to say, but say whatever is given you at that time, for it is not you who speak but the Holy Spirit. 12 Sibling will betray sibling to death and a father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death, 13 and you will be hated by all because of my name. But the one who endures to the end will be saved.

The Desolating Sacrilege

14 "But when you see the desolating sacrilege set up where it ought not to be (let the reader understand), then those in Judea must flee to the mountains; 15 the one on the housetop must not go down or enter to take anything from the house; 16 the one in the field must not turn back to get a coat. 17 Woe to those who are pregnant and to those who are nursing infants in those days! 18 Pray that it may not be in winter. 19 For in those days there will be suffering, such as has not been from the beginning of the creation that God created until now and never will be. 20 And if the Lord had not cut short those days, no one would be saved, but for the sake of the elect, whom he chose, he has cut short those days. 21 And if anyone says to you at that time, 'Look! Here is the Messiah!'[b] or 'Look! There he is!'—do not believe it. 22 False messiahs[c] and false prophets will appear and produce signs and wonders, to lead astray, if possible, the elect. 23 But be alert; I have already told you everything.
