Opening Meditation

Some say that happiness, according to the world around us, depends on 'happenings'. If things go according to what I have planned, then I am happy. But if the opposite is the case, happiness disappears. It is a happiness that comes and goes, it doesn't last. Jesus here is talking about happiness based on God's profound love for us. He is teaching us that if we seek happiness for happiness' sake, we will always be disappointed. However, if we seek God and his kingdom, happiness will be a reality regardless of the circumstances.

We think this world is the way things are. We think this world is normal. But it is not normal. It is not right. It is not the way God intended. Everything is upside-down and backwards.

Christ reveals this in the sermon of Luke 6. He challenges everything that people think is normal and flips it upside down to show how things really are from God's perspective, and how they will be in eternity. Because of this, each of His statements are shocking. Each statement of Christ is a jolt of reality in our twisted world.

Let us unite this day in the blessings and Woes of Jesus Christ sermon on the mount and the beatitudes.
